Recently our Hospice Manager advised me that since opening, we have provided short-term respite care to 450 people, plus a further 102 Guests received end-oflife care. Notably 50% of that end-of-life care - some 51 guests and their loved ones - have received that sacred care over the past two and a half years alone. Demand for our care has increased, especially with the challenges of COVID – as Anam Cara Colac, with its external entrance/exit to each hospice suite, was able to provide safe and family inclusive care – a notable exception to most public health providers.
