Greetings to you, our Anam Cara 'soul friends', as this year draws to a close and we prepare to hopefully celebrate Christmas with family and friends.

2021 has been another year of continuing to "hold the ground" at Anam Cara House Colac. Our care team, with the guidance of Karen Eccles our Hospice Manager, has remained focused on our mission, namely to skilfully and compassionately provide respite and end of life care to our regional community. In addition, when our Day programmes had to suspended at various times throughout the year, we continued to reach out to those at home, for example with phone and video calls, in order to remain connected and ameliorate isolation. Our care team, guided by Naomi Lettieri, Anam Cara's Community Liaison Nurse and assisted by some of our volunteers have provided this support not only during 2021 but since the onset of the coronavirus pandemic.

Over the past twelve months the community has continued to see Anam Cara House as a safe haven for family inclusive end of life care and as a result we have experienced a steady increase in demand for our care. Consequently, as well as providing short-term respite care throughout the year, it has been our privilege to care for 18 guests on their sacred end of life journey and to provide support to their carers and loved ones.

In this challenging year there has also been many encouraging milestones, including the ongoing support of our valued philanthropic partners the H & L Hecht Trust. Also at our November Annual General Meeting we were delighted to welcome two new Members to our Committee of Management - Maryjane Crabtree and Claire Dagley who respectively bring outstanding legal expertise and clinical experience to our Committee.

The care provided at Anam Cara Colac is possible due to the ongoing support of our local and wider community plus the commitment of our Committee of Management – and the exemplary care provided by our staff and volunteers who work hard to provide our outstanding "home like" specialised care.

We certainly conclude this year on a high, the tenth year since our official opening, having completed our third triennium of Accreditation (provisional) under the Quality Improvement Council Health & Community Service Standards and knowing we are proudly fulfilling our commitment to the South West Community, in the provision of excellence in short-term respite and end of life care.

An upgrade of our WiFi, 2 digital devices and 3 new Smart TV's means that we have the capability to do telehealth calls, it also means we can connect families with their loved ones at a time when being together is challenged by travel restrictions. Many of our guests have limited access to digital communication tools. Connecting people is an important part of ensuring that our guests receive the highest quality standards of care. It also means we can support good mental health and wellbeing of our guests through the digital world.
