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A word from ... Maryjane Crabtree, President

This March, a government taskforce released a report recommending measures to make more Australians selffund their aged care, as it becomes increasingly apparent that the Australian population is aging and will need more care than the government expects to be able to fund. Inside this decade, we will see more Australians over 65 than under 18 for the first time.

At Anam Cara Colac, we are seeing this playing out in growing demand for our service. Last year, in addition to expanding our range of respite and in home services, we cared for 20 guests in their final days. This year looks to be even busier. We love being able to provide our dedicated and compassionate care to more members of our community. but in the absence of secure and recurrent government funding, and very limited access to private health insurance dollars, we are dependent on the generosity of our community to keep our doors always open for guests who need end-of-life care.

It was this community that raised the initial money to purchase and set up Anam Cara House Colac and create the Anam Cara Colac Foundation Fund. We aim to supplement the income from the fund investments by diligently applying to government and philanthropic trusts for grants, a constant and time-consuming task supported by our Funding and Grants co-ordinator and executive team.



That is why our annual giving campaign has become a vital piece of our funding strategy. Last year our wonderful South West Victorian community donated a fabulous \$108,000 to our annual campaign, and we thank you all again for that generosity. Every cent of that has gone towards providing care. Our service is accessible to all community members, with no financial bias. We look towards our 2024 campaign to do even better, as our costs rise. At Anam Cara Colac, we do our very best to keep our costs at minimum, something we could not do without in-kind support from many Colac area businesses and the 1000's of hours our volunteers contribute - but it still costs nearly \$3,000 per day to stay open. Around 85% of our costs are in wages, another way we contribute to our community - as an employer!

As the end of the financial year approaches, we will be asking our community to support us again, as we cannot do what we do for our guests and their friends and families, without that support. Our Annual Appeal will launch in early June, so please answer our call!
